

## Introduction

Saudi Arabia is witnessing an unprecedented historical transformation in the empowerment of women, as their active participation in various fields has become a cornerstone in achieving the objectives of **Saudi Vision 2030**. The year 2024 reflects the continuation of this developmental path that has enabled Saudi women to become active partners in decision-making and leading change.

**The Women's Report 2024** reviews several sections, including population, health, education, labor, and culture. The report also presents the latest statistics related to women and highlights several indicators. These statistics contribute to accelerating the pace of progress in empowering women, intensifying efforts, and adopting high-quality and effective policies to achieve this goal.

Therefore, the **General Authority for Statistics (GASTAT)** is pleased to present this report, which is based on several sources, including surveys conducted by **GASTAT**, population estimates, and sources from various entities. The most important indicators related to women were compiled to provide the necessary data for decision-makers and policymakers, track the progress made in gender and diversity indicators, and enable both international and local comparisons.



## Concepts and terminology

Median Age	The age at which half of the population are older, and half are younger.
Educational Attainment	The highest level of education that an individual successfully completes. This is usually measured by the highest educational level that has been successfully finished and is typically validated by a recognized qualification.
Total Fertility Rate (TFR)	The rate at which a woman can conceive a child. If her lifelong reproductive behaviour matches the fertility rates of the previous year's general population.  Total fertility rate = (number of births in a given year ÷ number of women of middle age of pregnancy) × 1000.
Unemployment rate	An indicator that measures the percentage of the population aged 15 years and older that is participating in the labor force, as well as the percentage of the labor force that is unemployed 15 years and older. Unemployment rate = (unemployed persons $\div$ number of Individuals in the labor force (employed + unemployed)) $\times$ 100.
Labor force participation rate	An indicator that measures the percentage of the working-age population 15 years and older participating in the labor force as employed or unemployed is the ratio of the labor force to the population 15 years and older.
The government sector	The government sector subject to civil service regulations
Public sector	Public sector government workers are subject to social insurance regulations
Average gender pay gap	The difference between the mean wages of males and females is divided by the meanwages of males.  Mean gender pay gap = (mean males wages – mean female wages) ÷ mean male wages
Gender gap index	The difference in any field between females and men in terms of levels of participation, access to resources and rights, power, influence, wages, and benefits.  *International Labor Organization ILO  Gender gap = male ratio – female ratio

The table below shows the gaps between females and males in various fields. A value higher than 0 indicates a gap in favor of males, and a value lower than 0 indicates a gap in favor of females.


#### 2.1. Age distribution of Saudi females


The total number of Saudi females reached 9,807,663. Females in the childhood age group (0–14 years) accounted for 33.1% of the total, while those in the youth age group (15–34 years) made up 35.7%. Elderly females aged 60 years and above constituted 6.2% of the total number of Saudi females.





#### 3.1 Educational attainment








#### 4.3. Labor market enrollment by sector type


#### 4.4. Enrollment in the labor market by education level




#### 4.5. Employed females in leadership positions




The total number of Saudi females employed in the health sector reached 137,943, accounting for 45.6% of the total 302,771 Saudi health workers.








 Prevalence of anxiety among Saudi females (15 years and above)





Figure (13): Percentage of Saudi females of reproductive age (15–49 years) who have previously given birth (regardless of whether the children are currently alive or not)



Figure (14) Percentage of Saudi married females of reproductive age 15-49 years who are currently using any method of family planning








