Non-oil and oil exports decline by 9.3% and 38.7% in September 2020

Overall merchandise exports decreased by 31.1% in September 2020 compared to September 2019. The value of exports amounted to 53,317 million riyals in September 2020, down from 77,330 million riyals in September 2019. This decrease originated mainly from oil exports, which fell by 22,155 million riyals or 38.7% in the same period. The share of oil exports in total exports, therefore, decreased from 74.1% (September 2019) to 65.8% (September 2020). Also, compared to the previous month (August 2020), total merchandise exports decreased by -4,059 million riyals or 7.1%.

On the other hand, non-oil exports decreased by 9.3% year-on-year in September 2020, falling down to 18,209 million riyals from 20,067 million riyals in September 2019. Of the most important non-oil goods, 'Plastics and Rubber and Articles Thereof' (30.4% of non-oil merchandise exports) declined by 13.4% (-856 million riyals) and 'Products of the Chemical or Allied Industries' (30.1% of non-oil merchandise exports) declined by 1.6% (-87 million riyals) from September 2019. However, non-oil exports increased compared to the previous month (August 2020) by 451 million riyals or 2.5%.

Merchandise imports decreased by 8.1% (-3,564 million riyals) in September 2020. The value of imports amounted to 40,547 million riyals in September 2020 compared to 44,111 million riyals in September 2019. This decrease was due to the decrease in many sectors compared to September 2019, mainly 'Vehicles and Associated Transport Equipment' (-26.0%) and 'Machinery and Mechanical Appliances; Electrical Equipment' (-17.6%). Imports, however, increased compared to the previous month (August 2020), by 1,561 million riyals or 4.0%.

Ratio of Non-oil Exports to Imports decreased to 44.9%

The ratio of non-oil exports to imports decreased to 44.9% in September 2020 compared to 45.5% in September 2019. This is due to the fact that the decrease in non-oil exports (-9.3%) was more muted than the decrease in imports (-8.1%) during this period.

China is Saudi Arabia's main trading partner for merchandise trade

In September 2020, exports to China amounted to 8,960 million riyals, making this country the main destination for exports of Saudi Arabia. India and South Korea followed next with 5,631 million riyals and 5,100 million riyals, respectively. Japan, United Arab Emirates, the Netherlands, U.S.A, Egypt, Singapore, and Taiwan were the other countries that ranked in the top 10 destinations. Exports of Saudi Arabia to those 10 countries amounted to 36,211 million riyals, accounting for 67.9% of the total exports.

Imports from China amounted to 8,316 million riyals in September 2020, making this country the main origin for imports of Saudi Arabia. U.S.A and United Arab Emirates followed next with imports of 3,972 million riyals and 2,748 million riyals, respectively. India, Germany, Japan, Bahrain, Italy, South Korea and France were the other countries that ranked in the top 10 countries for imports. Imports of Saudi Arabia from those 10 countries amounted to 24,997 million riyals, accounting for 61.6% of the total imports.

Top Five Customs Ports for Imports

11,149 million riyals of imports, corresponding to 27.5% of the total, entered the Kingdom from Jeddah Islamic Sea Port in September 2020. Among the other major ports of entry for the imports were King Abdulaziz Port (20.2%), King Khalid International Airport (10.3%), Bat'ha (7.2%), and Riyadh (Dry Port) (6.3%). Those five ports together accounted for 71.5% of the total merchandise imports of the Kingdom.


Methodology

GASTAT's statistics on International trade are built on administrative records from Saudi Customs (non-oil) and the Ministry of Energy (oil). Saudi Arabia's merchandise exports and imports are classified according to the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding Systems (2017), also known as the Harmonized System (HS), which is maintained by the World Customs Organization (WCO). The HS allows countries to classify traded products in an internationally standardized system of product names and codes. Oil exports refer to exported goods classified in Chapter 27 (mineral fuels, mineral oils and products of their distillation; bituminous substances; mineral waxes) of the Harmonized System (HS). Non-oil exports refer to all other goods exported (including petrochemicals).
