Introduction

The United Nations (UN), along with the majority of its member states, celebrates International Youth Day on 12th August, 2020. This day was primarily aimed at using various civil societies, governments, and other organizations to review the status and the participation of youth so as to maximize their contributions in the society.

In this report, the youth in the 15-34 age group were assembled from among the majority Saudi population and were assigned important roles in the life activities and overall development of the country.

In its 2030 vision, Saudi Arabia has placed the emphasis on human resources and the great expectations from the youth of the kingdom in the attainment of the 2030 ambitious vision. The Crown Prince, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense, HRH Mohammad Bin Salman, explicitly noted, "Our youth are conscious, cultured and creative with high values." These words encapsulate the extent of expectations of the Saudi leadership from Saudi youth about their contribution in the Saudi 2030 vision.

As a matter of fact, several enablement initiatives such as commissions for intermediate and small businesses, support funds, education, and entrepreneurship training are primarily aimed at the Saudi youth.

This report identifies indicators and numbers to reflect the sheer size of the Youth age group among the Saudi population, it also elucidates their distribution on the basis of gender overall health and sporting activities. Additionally, the report also shows the progress achieved by the youth during the past few years, adaptation of novel technologies, their employment status, their COVID-19 status, as well as their participation in voluntary work.

Finally, the present report shows data in the form of figures and statistics about the status of Saudi youth and the constantly growing accomplishments among the kingdom's society. Their indispensable contributions towards the nation's development are steadily rising in nearly all facets of life, such as social life, education, and economy in general.




Percentage of Youth and Children out of Saudi Population, 2020

Percentage Distribution of Saudi Population by age group, 2020



Saudi youth in the age group (15-34 years) have the highest percentage of Saudi population amongst all age groups.




Percentage distribution of Saudi youth (15-34 years) by gender, 2020

Percentage distribution of Saudi youth, by age group and gender, 2020




Percentage distribution of Saudi youth (15-34 years) by marital status, 2019

Saudi youth (15-34 years) with the highest percentage of marital status by age group and gender, 2019



According to youths' response for the reasons why they are still unmarried, the highest percentage was due to the high cost of living for both males and females. It was noted that the largest difference between males and females was the difficulty of finding the right partner, with a 11.7% of females and only 1.9% of males.




Percentage of Saudi youth (15 -34 years) who suffer from chronic diseases out of total Saudi population*, 2018


Within Saudi youth, males have about three times higher mortality rate compared to females.


Percentage of Saudi youth (18-30 years) fatalities out of total fatalities due to traffic accidents, in the past 5 years

Saudi youth (18-30 years) fatalities due to traffic accidents by gender, 2019







The main motive for the majority of Saudi females is to enhance their health. However, in the case of males, they practice sport for recreation and physical fitness.

Most Saudis are unwilling to practice sport (55.5% males and 48.3% females). However, lack of enough time was the second reason for males (27.6%), while lack of enough facilities in the district was the second reason for females (24.5%).

The majority of females (49.8%) use modern applications while exercising. On the other hand, a large percentage of males (71.9%) warm up before exercising.





Percentage distribution of Saudi youth (15-34 years) according to type of difficulties they encounter while studying by gender, 2019



The majority of Saudi youth encounters no difficulties while studying, about 68% of both males and females chose this answer.




Saudi transition rate in secondary education* by gender, 2019






Economy



In 2019, 1,489,520 workers in the labor force were young Saudis within the ages of 15-34 years with percentage of 47% out of total Saudi workers.


Percentage distribution of Saudi youth workers (15-34 years) by gender, 2019

Saudi youth employed (15-34 years) by gender and age group, out of total Saudi youth employed population, 2019



Shares of methods to find a job applied by gender (15- 34 years), 2019





Over the past 4 years, young Saudi labor force participation rate has increased by 4.4 percentage points. This increment is due to the increase in the participation rate of females which was 6.3 percentage points compared to 2 percentage points for males.




This is credited to the Vision 2030's goal of increasing the females participation rates by creating more job opportunities in the job market for females. However, the participation rate of young Saudi females is still less than half the participation rate of young Saudi males.

^{*}Labor force participation rate is an indicator that measures the participation of the working-age population (15-34 years) in the labor force as employed or unemployed individuals, which is the ratio of the labor force to the population aged 15-34 years.

During the past four years, the unemployment rate for Saudi youth decreased by 11.5 percentage points. The decrease in females' unemployment rate was higher than males (13.9 and 11.6 percentage points, respectively) as a result of government efforts to empower young Saudi women in their working fields. However, the unemployment rate for females is higher than three times the unemployment rate for males.

Unemployed individuals: Individuals (15 years and above) who were:

^{*}Unemployment rate: It is an indicator that measures people who are unemployed at the working-age population (15 +) and who are part of in the labor force. It is calculated as a ratio of the unemployed to the labor force.

¹⁻ Without a job in the week preceding the household visit.


²⁻ Seriously looking for work during the four weeks preceding the household visit (and have followed at least one method to look for a job). This category also includes those who did not search for work because they were waiting to start an already agreed job or because they want to set up their own business since.

The unemployment rate in Saudi Arabia - Saudi and non Saudi- was 22.5%. However, once the non Saudis were excluded, the rate rose to 29% for only Saudis which is considered to be high amongst G20 countries.




About two third of Saudi youth (63.0%) find their monthly income sufficient enough to meet financial obligations.


Percentage distribution of Saudi youth (15-34 years) who have monthly income by saving situation, 2019

Distribution of saving reasons for Saudi youth (15-34 years) by gender, 2019



Saving for emergency was the most reason of saving for females and males with (58.8%) and (35.3%) respectively.




Distribution of incorporation reasons chosen by Saudi youth (15-34 years), 2019











Percentage of the most internet activities chosen by Saudi youth (15-34 years) by gender, 2019











A large percentage of both males (63.2%) and females (65.2%) answered that there is no effect of social networking on their actual life. 




The total confirmed cases of Covid-19 reached 36,909 cases within Saudi youth (15-34 years) in Q2, 2020. They accounted for 43.4% of the total confirmed cases of Saudi population in the same period.

Percentage Distribution of confirmed cases of Covid-19 for Saudi youth (15-34 years) by gender in Q2, 2020




The number of total cases among young Saudi people of the same age group started to increase noticeably from the end of May 2020 to reach its highest peak in the second week of June 2020 as the number of infected reached 7532 cases. This was coincided with the second stage of returning to normal life in Saudi, which included reducing the curfew, lifting the suspension of domestic flights and partially returning to work, in addition to conducting the expanded testing.



VOLUNTEERING DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The number of volunteers in the health volunteering platform to combat the Coronavirus pandemic reached a total of 63,507 Saudi youth volunteers within the age group (15-34 years) in Q2, 2020. They represent 74.7% of the total volunteers.
